Sailing on the North Wind Schooner

The Porch Club and friends enjoyed a lovely sail on the Delaware River on June 9, 2024. The adventure was aboard the North Wind Schooner, a tri-masted tall ship operated by Gloucester City Sail, a volunteer-led non-profit organization with a mission to give area youth the opportunity to do science, learn history, and work on the schooner. To pay for the youth programs, the North Wind offers 2-hour sails on the Delaware River providing closeups of the Walt Whitman or Ben Franklin Bridges, the battleship New Jersey, and a unique view of the Camden and Philadelphia waterfronts. Thirty "sailors" enjoyed light refreshments and a warm breeze while the captain and first mate entertained their guests with seafaring stories and an overview of the ecology of the river.
